LifeFlight Of Maine Completes The Fleet To Provide Mainers With Upgraded Critical Care Air Transport

(Auburn, ME) LifeFlight of Maine is the state's only emergency air ambulance service, bringing advanced skills, medical technology, pharmacy, blood, and more directly to a patient's side, wherever he/she is.

Looking toward the horizon is a necessity in air medical transport, so in 2016, LifeFlight began the effort to replace, modernize, and standardize the helicopter fleet. Standardization is invaluable to the pilots, mechanics, and clinical crews who move from one aircraft to another, because the layout, avionics, medical mounts, and lighting are consistent.

Lima Foxtrot (N901LF) joined the Maine fleet in November 2020, and Xray Mike (N901XM) went into service in March 2021. In October 2022, the final new helicopter, Whiskey Mike (N901WM), joined the fleet and began transporting patients.

On Wednesday, December 21st the three new helicopters lined up together for the first time outside LifeFlight's hangar in Auburn to celebrate the completion of the upgraded fleet.

"This truly is a gift to Maine, from the people of Maine," said LifeFlight Foundation Executive Director Kate O'Halloran. "It is because of their generous support that LifeFlight is now able to better serve our family, friends, colleagues, and neighbors wherever and whenever they need us."

The cost of each specialized medical helicopter is \$6.3 million. This fleet upgrade was made possible thanks to gifts from more than 7,500 donors -- a combination of individuals, family and private foundations, and Maine businesses.

Over the past 23 years, LifeFlight has safely cared for 35,000 patients of all ages—from premature infants and critically injured children, to adults and seniors who need specialty care. The calls for help come from all points in Maine—from mountains, lakes, and coastal islands; from highways, trails, and main streets; and most importantly, from hospital to hospital.

Much more than their iconic helicopters, the LifeFlight fleet are flying intensive care units, staffed by experienced pilots, highly-trained critical care nurses and paramedics, and equipped with life-saving medical technology that is often not available at many rural hospitals. When Mainers see LifeFlight's signature aircraft overhead, there is likely a crew onboard, working against the clock to give someone a second chance.

"We acquired our first two original helicopters in 2003 and they have been incredible workhorses," said Tom Judge, the Founder and Executive Director of LifeFlight of Maine. "In 2023 we will celebrate 25 years of being able to care for and safely transport Maine's most ill and injured patients. These new helicopters feature more power, speed, a larger interior workspace, and advanced aviation electronics. All this translates to more patients served, and served more quickly, safely and reliably for years to come. This is a big moment for all of Maine."

About LifeFlight of Maine

LifeFlight of Maine is the state's only air medical and critical care transport organization, which brings high-level care and advanced equipment directly to the patient. In 2022, LifeFlight cared for more than 2,500 patients and has transported more than 35,000 patients since it was founded in 1998. LifeFlight operates from bases in Sanford, Lewiston, and Bangor, Maine, using four helicopters, a fixed-wing airplane, rapid response vehicles, and specialized ground ambulances. These medical teams care for Maine by partnering 24/7/365 with local EMS, fire/rescue, and hospital provider. LifeFlight's commitment to Maine is that every person, in every community, has access to critical care and medical transport when needed.

About the LifeFlight Foundation

By raising philanthropic dollars and statewide awareness about the organization and its mission, the LifeFlight Foundation helps ensure that Maine's most vulnerable patients receive the highest quality care when every minute counts.
